Introduction

Why non-formal learning?

- Need to re-imagine educational practices to meet diverse learning needs.
- Formal education: structured, but less adaptable to individual needs.
- Non-Formal Learning:
 learner-centered, flexible, practical.







Overview of Learning Types







Formal education

- Structured
- formalized
- leads to certification

Non-formal Education

- Structured, but flexible
- learner-centered
- participatory
- voluntary

Informal learning

- Not structured
- ongoing/everydaylearning
- o influenced by peers/friends/family





Main Characteristics of Non-Formal Learning

- voluntary
- accessible
- organised process with educational objectives
- participatory
- learner-centred
- focused on soft skills and personal growth.
- organised on the basis of the needs of the participants.







Examples of NFL activities

Interactive Workshops and Trainings

- Provide a collaborative space for learners to interact and work together.
- Focus on facilitation and group work
 rather than passive presentations.

Key elements: active participation, collaboration, dialogue, and real-world







Examples of NFL activities

Peer Learning and Collaborative Activities

- Central to NFL, using collective knowledge and experiences of participants.
- Emphasize empathy, respect, and mutual understanding
- Promote cognitive and social skill development through collaboration

Methods: Small groups, study circles, collaborative







Examples of NFL activities

Experiential Learning

 Engages learners in real-life challenges and encourages reflection

 Enhances understanding and builds essential life skills

Focuses on reflection to internalize
 experiences and apply insights to future
 challenges.

- Promotes lifelong learning








Strategies for Integration

Case-study example

Educational Programme: "Don't Be in a Hurry to Throw Away the Garbage"

- Developed by K.A.NE. and implemented in secondary education schools
- Focus: Plastic waste reduction and environmental awareness.
- Linked to curriculum across different subjects (Math, Science, Language, Art, etc).
